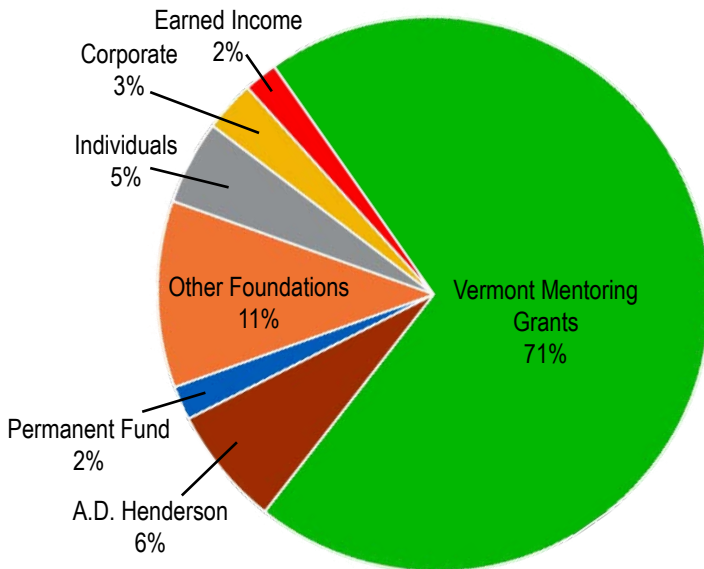
Our Mission

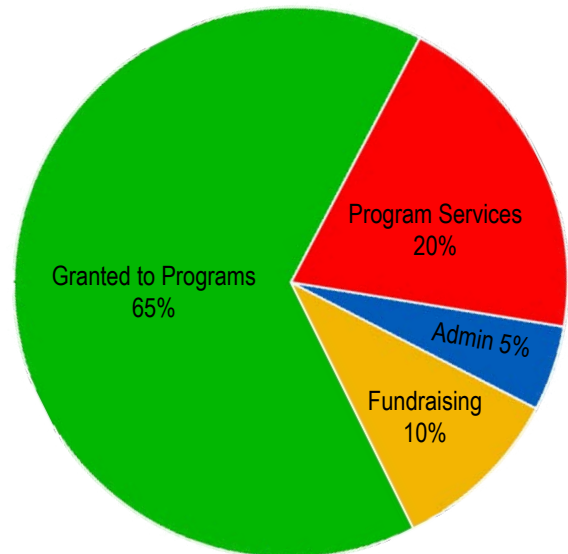
Fiscal Year 2015-2016 Financials

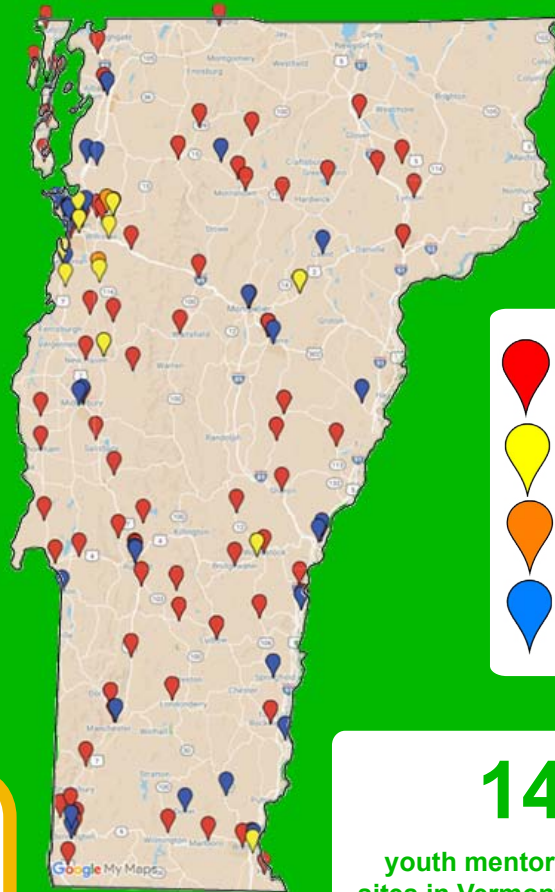
